Tuesday, July 12, 2005

Andre and his wife Mondestine are still recovering from their injuries in a hospital in New Mexico. They are looking to be released by week's end, but it may be as late as the middle of next week. The release date will ultimately be a decision by their medical team. When released, Andre and Mondestine will return to the Bay area together.

Funeral services for Torrienne and Tristine (son and daughter) are not yet planned but tentatively scheduled for the end of next week. Information will be passed on as soon as it is available.

We are thinking about starting some sort of fund in remembrance of Torrienne and Tristine sponsored by NJB and friends. As this idea develops, we will also pass the information to you. We will also post information regarding this fund on the Silicon Valley NJB web site. I know all of you will also help pass the word by posting information on your individual web site when all the details are finalized.

Wednesday, July 6, 2005

To the Chapter Directors and Board of Directors of Silicon Valley NJB:

I find it necessary to inform you of some tragic news of which some of you may have already heard. Prior to the start of the 4<sup>th</sup> of July week-end, Andre Hunt and his family was in a tragic accident in New Mexico while checking out colleges for their son to attend who had recently graduated from High School here in San Jose. I had previously refrained from emailing this type of message for fear of not communicating precise and exact specific detail of such a tragedy. I now feel compelled to send out this message now as today I heard that people were saying that Tim Hunt's family (Andre's brother) was killed in the accident and that is not true. Andre and his family

lost their college bound son and their high school daughter as the four of them was together on the trip. I will not go into a lot of detail, but I wanted to clear up the incorrect information that it was Tim's family.

For those of you who have gotten to know Andre over the years of working with him in NJB, you should know how passionate he is about working to put good sports programs such as basketball and football in place for the kids in our communities. It is a devastating situation for him to lose both of his younger kids in a tragic car crash (single car accident). Although he has an older son, the loss of his two younger children in the tragic accident is beyond comprehension. I request your thoughts and prayers for Andre and his wife as they move forward with their lives after this tragedy. Physically Andre and his wife are in pretty good condition considering the severity of the accident. Andre has hopes of being back in San Jose by Thursday or Friday. Perhaps once he gets back another message with more detail may be sent out. But for now, I don't want to try and describe Andre's or his wife's condition except to say that they are doing pretty good considering the extent of the accident.

Thanking you in advance for the positive thoughts and prayers for Andre and his family.
